Lok Sabha elections 2009

Lok Sabha 2009 elections in Arunachal Pradesh were held on April 16th 2009 for two constituencies, Arunachal East and Arunachal West. This chapter includes analysis of voting trend, criminalization and money power in these elections.

Political Parties and Candidates

In Lok Sabha 2004, 6 parties contested. This came down to 5 parties in the Lok Sabha 2009 elections. There was a reduction in the number of candidates as well. In Lok Sabha 2004 elections 13 candidates contested. This came down to 8 candidates in Lok Sabha 2009 elections.

Executive summary

- Affidavits of all 8 candidates contesting the Lok Sabha 2009 elections were analyzed by the Arunachal Pradesh Election Watch.
- 1 of these 8 candidates had a pending criminal case.
- Average asset for a candidate from Arunachal Pradesh was Rs. 2.3 crores.
- Both constituencies were won by INC.
- There were no pending criminal cases on MPs from Arunachal Pradesh.
- Average asset for an MP from Arunachal Pradesh was Rs. 6.4 crores.
- Both MPs did not declare their PAN details.
- There were no female candidates from Arunachal Pradesh.

Voting and winning trend

The % of votes polled by major parties

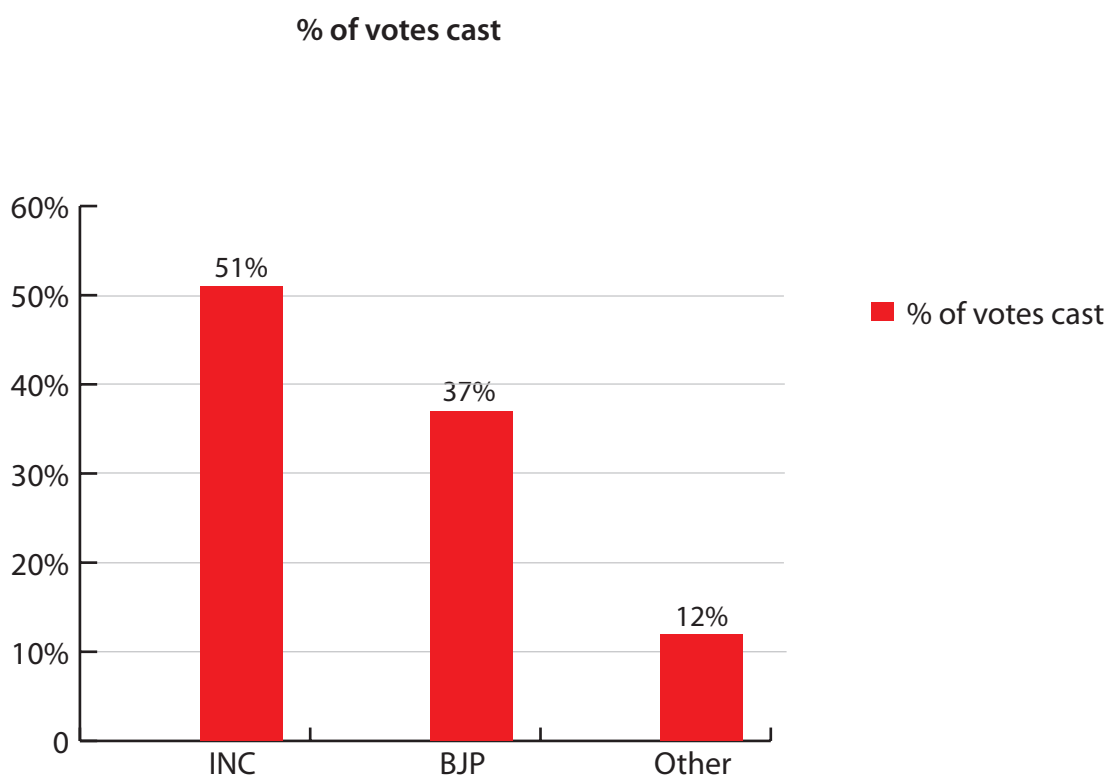
INC managed to get 51% of the votes polled. This was 35% of the electorate. BJP managed to get 37% of all votes cast. The total electorate in Arunachal Pradesh was 7,35,799 and the total votes cast were 5,00,642.
