Analysis of Income & Expenditure of Major Political Parties of Tamil Nadu & Puducherry <u>Five Years Report</u> (FY 2010-11 to 2014-15)

Introduction

Political parties have multiple sources of funding and thus accountability and transparency should be an important aspect of their functioning. It is essential to have comprehensive and transparent accounting methods and systems which should reveal the true financial position of the parties.

The Election Commission of India (ECI), in its <u>letter</u> dated 19th November,'14 addressed to the Presidents/General Secretaries of all political parties, stated that it was mandatory for the parties to submit details of their audited report to the Commission. This report analyses the total income and expenditure incurred by **4 State Parties** of Tamil Nadu (AIADMK, DMK, DMDK and PMK) and **1 State Party** of Puducherry (AINRC) during 5 FYs from 2010-11 to 2014-15, as declared by the parties in their IT Returns submitted to the ECI.

Total Income of State Parties of Tamil Nadu & Puducherry: FY 2010-11 to 2014-15

- The total Income of the 5 State Political Parties have been compiled from the income from various sources pan India, as submitted in their Income Tax Returns.
- Four State Parties of Tamil Nadu (AIADMK, DMK, DMDK and PMK), whose IT Returns are available in the public domain, have declared a total income of Rs 308.05 crores, collected from all over India. This excludes PMK for 3 years as it has not submitted ITR for FY 2010-11, 2011-12, and 2012-13.
- DMK has shown the highest income amongst the State Parties with a total income of Rs 158.52 crores collectively during 5 FYs 2010-11 to 2014-15. This constitutes 51.46% of the total income of all the 4 State Parties, collectively during FY 2010-11 to 2014-15.
- AIADMK declared the second highest income of Rs 119.24 crores which forms 38.71% of the total income of the State Parties.
- **PMK** declared the least income of **Rs 8.98 crores** amongst all state parties of Tamil Nadu. This forms a mere **2.92%** of the total income of the State Parties between FY 2010-11 to 2014-15.
- Total Income of parties increased by 165.35% between FY 2012-13 to 2013-14 where they saw an increase of Rs 85.55 crores
- Rs 137.29 crores or **45% of the total income** that was received by regional parties of Tamil Nadu was **during** a single year, FY-2013-14.
- AINRC, formed in 2011 and state party of Puducherry, is the only party whose income has increased from FY 2013-14 to 2014-15. This was an increase of 45.11% or Rs 3.14 lakhs from FY 2013-14.



Top 3 sources of income of 4 State Parties of Tamil Nadu from FY 2010-11 to 2014-15


- The biggest source of income for DMK during FY 2010-11 to 2014-15 was 'Surplus from specific Funds' through which the party received a whopping sum of Rs 122.60 crores, which constitutes 77.34% of its total income.
- Majority of the State Parties of Tamil Nadu have declared Election Nomination Fees as one of their 3 main sources of income; AIADMK Rs 40.82 crores, DMK Rs 13.18 crores, DMDK Rs 6.37 crores.
- Interest Income is the second highest source of income for these parties, after the Election Nomination Fees. AIADMK collected Rs 41.88 crores, DMK Rs 10.65 crores, followed by DMDK which collected Rs 2.18 crores. This totals to Rs 54.71 crores.
- **Membership Fees & Subscription** is the third highest and the most commonly shared source of income. AIADMK collected Rs 35.68 crores, DMK Rs 8 crores, followed by PMK which collected Rs 2.37 crores and





DMDK which collected Rs 1.67 crores. This totals to Rs 47.72 crores.

• AINRC, formed in 2011, has received 100% of its total income from Grants/Donations/Contributions. This was worth 0.17 crores.



Top 3 items of expenditure of 4 State Parties of Tamil Nadu from FY 2010-11 to 2014-15

- The maximum expenditure of AIADMK between FY 2010-11 and 2014-15 was towards Advertising & Publicity where the party declared spending a total of Rs 29.08 crores, closely followed by expenses towards Election Expenditure of Rs 27.95 crores.
- The maximum expenditure of **DMK** during the same period was **Rs 15.68 crores** towards **Deficit from Specific Funds**, followed by **Party Development Expenses** of **Rs 13.81 crores** and expenses towards **Depreciation** of **Rs 9.06 crores**.
- DMDK spent the maximum amount of Rs. 5.62 crores on Advertising & Publicity followed by Rs 3.70 crores on expenditure on Charity and Welfare and Rs. 2.88 crores on Election Expenses.
- **Election Expenses, Advertising & Publicity, Donations** and **Depreciation** are the highest and most common items of expenditure for state parties of both Tamil Nadu and Puducherry.
- **50.61**% of the total expenditure of **AINRC** was towards Election Expenditure, Publicity Expenses, Printed Materials, Pamphlets, Posters, Media, Newspapers, Magazines & Rally, collectively.

Issues related to disclosure of financial statements by political parties

Sections 13A of the Income Tax Act clearly indicates that the object is to ensure that there is transparency in the process of financial functioning of the political parties. ADR, while gathering the income tax returns of political parties by filing of RTIs in the respective Income Tax department/circle, has come across various instances where many state/regional parties recognized by ECI have not filed their income tax returns.

Political parties have been exempted from paying tax, however, to claim such exemption, they have to maintain audited accounts and comply with provisions of the Income Tax Act. Some regional parties have defaulted on this account on a regular basis. They have been openly flouting the provisions of the Income Tax Act and are not filing their annual income returns, which is a violation of the mandatory provisions laid down in law. Many of these parties are major regional parties in their respective state/region and their financial position is not known.





Need for a strict mechanism for reporting financial information

To ensure that there is financial transparency and accountability on the part of the political parties, there must be a strict mechanism with respect to reporting of financial information. The procedures and reporting framework must be standardized to ensure that a true picture of the financial position of the political parties is revealed to the general public. Institute of Chartered Accounts of India (ICAI) has put forward a set of recommendations on the request of the Election Commission of India (ECI). These recommendations relate to a standardized and comprehensive reporting framework of financial statements of political parties. ADR feels that there is a dire need for these recommendations to be implemented at the earliest.

Recommendations of ADR

- The ECI had issued guidelines in 2014 to the political parties in order to promote transparency in the parties'
 functioning and to aid the Commission to conduct free and fair elections. Those parties playing a decisive role
 in the political arena should lead by example and voluntarily disclose details of their financial transactions to
 the ECI every financial year.
- Those parties not following the ICAI guidelines for auditing of reports should be scrutinized by the IT department.
- The National and regional political parties must provide all information on their finances under the Right to Information Act. This will only strengthen political parties, elections and democracy.
