Madhya Pradesh Election Watch^{*} Lok Sabha elections 2009

Lok Sabha 2009 elections were held in two phases in Madhya Pradesh on 23 April 2009 and 30 April 2009. This chapter includes the analysis of voting trend, criminalization, money power, gender, etc in these elections. Information provided by ECI and details from the affidavits filed by the contesting candidates have been used for above analysis.

Growth of political parties

In Lok Sabha 2004, 26 parties contested elections which rose to 40 in Lok Sabha elections 2009. This reflects a rise of 54 % in the number of parties from 2004 Lok Sabha elections to 2009 Lok Sabha elections.

Growth in number of <u>candidates</u>

In Lok Sabha 2004 Elections, the total number of candidates contesting elections for 29 seats in the State was 294, which rose to 429 in the 2009 elections. The state witnessed an increase in number of candidates by 135 or 46%.

Executive summary for <u>candidates</u> and <u>MPs</u>

Summary for candidates

- A total of 429 candidates contested Lok Sabha 2009 elections from Madhya Pradesh.
- Out of the total 429 candidates, 42 candidates or 10% declared pending criminal cases against them.
- Out of these 42 candidates with pending criminal cases, 26 had pending serious criminal cases like murder, attempt to murder, kidnapping, robbery, extortion etc.
- There were 89 IPC charges of serious nature on the candidates which included murder, attempt to murder, kidnapping, extortion, etc.
- There were 6 red alert constituencies where 3 or more candidates had pending criminal cases. There were 4

candidates with pending criminal cases who contested from Khandwa constituency.

- Out of the 429 candidates, it was observed that 43 candidates, i.e. 10% were crorepatis.
- A total of 9 candidates declared zero assets.
- A total of 46 candidates declared liabilities in excess of Rs. 5 lakhs.
- Average assets for candidates of BJP, INC and BSP were approximately about Rs. 1.22 crores, Rs. 4.66 crores and Rs. 56.16 lakhs respectively.
- A total of 327 out of 429 candidates i.e., 76.2% had not furnished PAN details.
- Out of 429 candidates, only 7% or 29 women candidates contested elections.
- Only 36.36 % of the total candidates (156 out of 429) were graduates & above.
- BJP managed to get 43% of the votes polled and 22% registered voters. INC secured 40 % of the total votes polled and 21% of the registered voters. About 83% of the votes polled went in favor of BJP or INC.

Summary for MPs

- Out of the 29 MPs from Madhya Pradesh in Lok Sabha 2009, 4 MPs have pending criminal cases against them.
- Out of these 4 MPs, there were pending serious criminal cases against 2 MPs.
- Compared with 2004 Lok Sabha, there has been a decline in number of MPs with pending criminal cases from 7 in Lok Sabha 2004 to 4 to Lok Sabha 2009.
- A total of 15 MPs (52%) from Madhya Pradesh are crorepatis.
- The average assets for MP of INC, BJP and BSP were Rs. 4.97 crores, Rs. 1.27 crores and Rs. 3.08 crores respectively.
- Average asset for a MP in Madhya Pradesh is Rs. 2.86 crores.
- Out of the 29 MPs, 1 MP had not furnished PAN details.
- Out of the 29 women candidates, 6 managed to win. Hence only 21% of MPs from Madhya Pradesh in current Lok Sabha are women.


Voting analysis

Total voting in the state was 51%. BJP managed to get 43% of the votes cast and 22% registered voters. INC secured 40 % of the total votes cast and 21% of the registered voters. BSP secured 6% of the total votes cast and only 3% of the registered voters. About 83% of the votes cast went in favor of BJP or INC. Other political parties and independent candidates did not receive a sizable amount of votes cast. The total electorate in Madhya Pradesh was 3, 80, 82,678 and the total votes cast were 1,94,84,608.

Figure: Per cent of votes cast in Madhya Pradesh: Party-wise




Candidates vs MPs

Out of the total 429 candidates, 42 candidates or 10% declared pending criminal cases against them. Out of these 42 candidates with pending criminal cases, 26 had pending serious criminal cases like murder, attempt to murder, kidnapping, robbery, extortion etc.


Party wise break up for candidates with pending criminal cases

Total 42 candidates contesting elections from Madhya Pradesh had pending criminal cases against them. Out of these 42 candidates with pending criminal cases, 26 had pending serious criminal cases against them. These serious cases include murder and related charges, kidnapping, extortion, dacoity, theft, robbery etc. Out of 28 candidates of INC, 8 (29%) had pending criminal cases. 2 candidates out of 29 candidates of BJP (7%) and 6 candidates out of the total 28 candidates of BSP (21%) had declared pending criminal cases. The break up is given in the table below.

Figure: Serious IPC section break up for candidates of major parties





Figure: Comparison of total serious crimes vs. total violent crimes (murder, kidnapping, etc)-party wise



<u>Party wise</u> comparison of pending criminal cases on <u>candidates</u> in Lok Sabha 2004 & Lok Sabha 2009

A comparison between 2009 & 2004 Lok Sabha elections of candidates from 3 major parties and with pending criminal cases shows that , the number of candidates with pending criminal cases has decreased in 2009 elections as compared to 2004 elections for BJP and BSP. The number of candidates with pending criminal cases has increased for INC (from 24% to 29%).


Pending criminal cases- analysis for MPs

Out of the 29 MPs from Madhya Pradesh in Lok Sabha 2009, 4 MPs have pending criminal cases against them. Out of these 4 MPs, pending serious criminal cases are against 2 MPs. Contrasting this with Lok Sabha 2004, there has been a decline in number of MPs with pending criminal cases from 7 to 4 in Lok Sabha 2009.

Figure: Comparison Lok Sabha 2004 & Lok Sabha 2009- MPs with pending criminal cases







Figure: Crorepati candidates from major parties








Analysis based on assets- for MPs

15 MPs in Lok Sabha 2009 from Madhya Pradesh are crorepatis as compared to 7 crorepati MPs from Lok Sabha 2004, i.e. an increase of 114%. The average asset of a MP in 2004 Lok Sabha was Rs 95 lakhs which rose to Rs 2.86 crores in 2009. Between 2004 & 2009 there has been an average asset increase of 201 % for MPs.

The table below reflects that 15 MPs out of the total 29 winning candidates have been those with assets more than 1 crore. This clearly shows that chances of winning and total assets of a candidate are directly proportional to each other.



Figure: Comparison average assets for candidates & MPs in Lok Sabha 2009






