Lok Sabha elections 2009

Lok Sabha 2009 elections in Meghalaya were held on April 16th 2009 for two constituencies, Shillong and Tura. This chapter includes analysis of voting trend, criminalization and money power in these elections.

Political Parties and Candidates

In Lok Sabha 2004, 8 parties contested. This went down to 7 parties in the Lok Sabha 2009 election. In Lok Sabha 2004 elections 12 candidates contested. This went down to 11 candidates in Lok Sabha 2009 elections.

Executive summary

- Affidavits of all 11 candidates contesting the Lok Sabha 2009 elections were analyzed by the Meghalaya Election Watch*
- 1 of these 11 candidates had a pending criminal case.
- The Shillong constituency was won by INC and the Tura constituency was won by NCP.
- 1 MP, Vincent H Pala, did not declare PAN details.
- There were 3 female candidates from Meghalaya. 1 of these female candidates, Agatha K Sangma won from the Tura constituency.

The % of votes polled by major parties

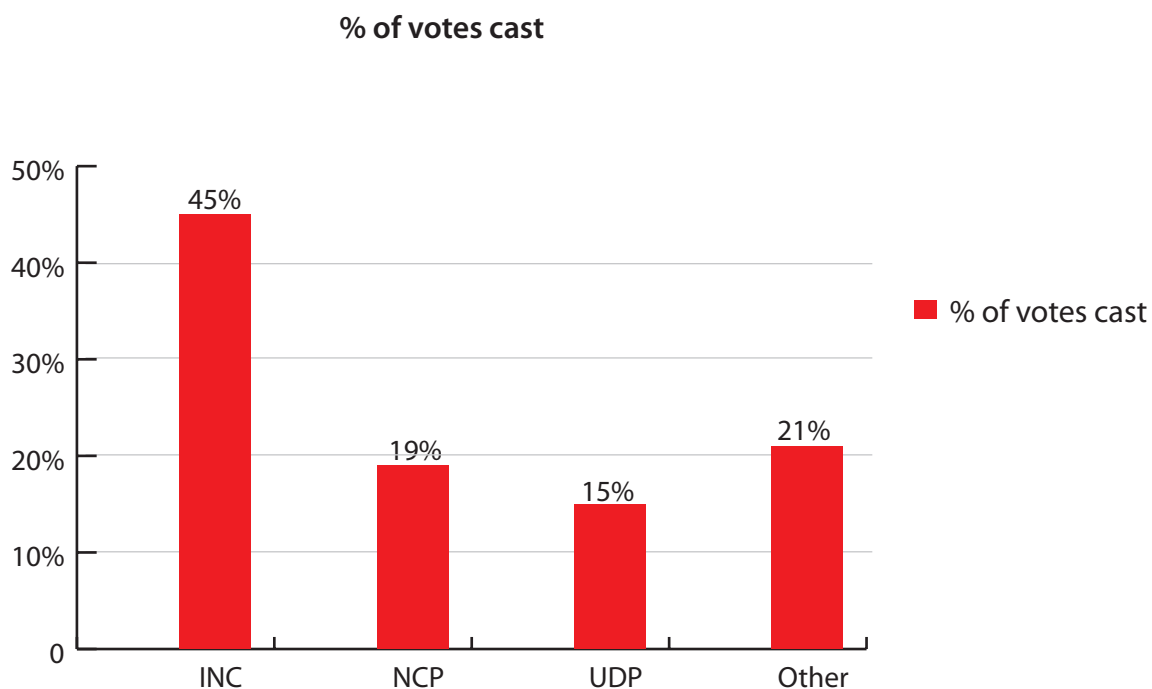
INC managed to get 45% of the votes cast. This was 29% of the electorate. The total electorate in Meghalaya was 12,77,739 and the total votes cast were 8,22,566.
