Analysis of Income & Expenditure of Regional Political Parties for FY 2020-21

Executive Summary

Political parties have multiple sources of funding and thus accountability and transparency should be an important aspect of their functioning. It is essential to have comprehensive and transparent accounting methods and systems which should reveal the true financial position of the parties.

The Election Commission of India (ECI), in its letter dated 19th November,'14 addressed to the Presidents/General Secretaries of all political parties, stated that it was mandatory for the parties to submit details of their audited reports to the Commission. This report analyses the total income and expenditure incurred, all over India, by **31 out of 54 Regional Parties** during FY 2020-21, as declared by the parties in their IT Returns submitted to the ECI.

The Regional Parties include AAP, AGP, AIADMK, AIFB, AIMIM, AINRC, BJD, CPI(ML) (L), DMDK, DMK, GFP, JDS, JDU, JKPDP, JMM, KC-M, MGP, MNS, NDPP, NPF, PDA, PMK, RLD, SAD, SDF, SHS, SKM, TDP, TRS, YSR-C and ZNP.

Status of submission of audited reports by the Regional Parties, FY 2020-21

- The due date for submission of annual audited accounts for the parties was 31st October,'21.
- 5 parties had submitted their audit reports on time, while 26 parties delayed their submission by several days, ranging from 1 day to 144 days.
- Audit Reports of the remaining 23 Regional Parties for FY 2020-21 are unavailable on the website of the ECI at the
 time of preparation of this report. These include some major political parties like AJSU, RJD, SP, BPF, JKNC, and
 AIUDF etc.
- Hence, this report analyses the income and expenditure of **31 Regional Political Parties**, whose audit reports are available on the ECI website, for **FY 2020-21**.



Total income declared by Regional Political Parties, FY 2020-21

- The total income of the **31** Regional Parties for the FY 2020-21 was **Rs 529.416 cr**.
- DMK reported having the highest income of Rs 149.95 cr, which forms 28.324% of the total income of all the parties analysed, followed by YSR-Congress with an income of Rs 107.99 cr or 20.398% and BJD whose income was Rs 73.347 cr or 13.854% of the total income of the 31 Regional parties analysed in this report.
- The **total income of top 5 parties** amounted to **Rs 434.255 cr**, which comprised **82.03**% of the total income of the political parties analysed, collectively.



Comparison of Income of Regional Parties, FY 2019-20 and FY 2020-21

- Out of a total of **29 parties** from 31 political parties whose data is available for both the years, **10 parties** have shown an **increase in their income** from FY 2019-20 to FY 2020-21 while **19 parties** have shown a **decline in their income** during this period.
- Total income of the 29 parties decreased from Rs 800.264 cr in FY 2019-20 to Rs 520.492 cr in FY 2020-21, a total decrease of 34.96% or Rs 279.775 cr.
- **DMK** reported the highest increase in its income of **Rs 85.046 cr** followed by **JDU** and **YSR-Congress** which declared a total increase of **Rs 41.956 cr** and **Rs 15.251 cr** respectively, between FY 2019-20 and FY 2020-21.

Unspent Income of Regional Parties, FY 2020-21


- There are **17** Regional parties who declared a part of their **income as remaining unspent** for the FY 2020-21 while **14** political parties **spent more than the income collected** during the year.
- YSR-Congress has more than 99.25% of its total income remaining unspent while BJD and AIMIM have 90.44% and 88.02%, respectively, of their income remaining unspent for FY 2020-21.
- DMK, AIADMK, TDP, JDS, CPI(ML)(L), PMK, SKM, JMM, RLD, AGP, ZNP, NPF, SDF and JKPDP are the 14 Regional parties
 that declared spending more than their income. TDP has declared spending highest amount of Rs 51.517 cr or 1584.16%
 more than its income.






Total expenditure incurred by Regional Parties, FY 2020-21

- The total declared expenditure of the 31 Regional parties for the FY 2020-21 was Rs 414.028 cr.
- Total expenditure incurred by the **top 5 parties** is **Rs 362.321 cr** or **87.51**% of the total expenditure as reported by the 31 political parties.
- Top 5 parties that have incurred highest expenditure are DMK which had spent Rs 218.49 cr or 52.77%, followed by TDP which spent Rs 54.769 cr or 13.23%, AIADMK which spent Rs 42.367 cr or 10.23%, JDU which spent Rs 24.347 cr or 5.88% and TRS which spent Rs 22.348 cr or 5.40% of the total expenditure.



All sources of Income declared by Regional Political parties, FY 2020-21

- 31 Regional Parties collected Rs 376.865 cr or 71.19% of their total income from voluntary contributions (includes Donations & Contributions and Electoral Bonds) for FY 2020-21.
- Under voluntary contributions, political parties collected **47.34**% or **Rs 250.60** cr of their income from *Donations through Electoral Bonds* while other Donations & Contributions amounted to **Rs 126.265** cr or **23.85**% for FY 2020-21.
- Only 5 of the 31 Regional Parties that were analysed declared **donations through Electoral Bonds** amounting to **Rs** 250.60 cr.
- **15.99%** or **Rs 84.64 cr** of the total income was generated through **Interest Income** by the 31 Regional Parties during FY 2020-21.







Observations of ADR

- Audit reports of 26 parties were available on the ECI website after a delay of 1 day to 144 days from the last date of submission.
- The income tax returns/audit reports of **23** Regional Parties are not available on the ECI website at the time of preparation of this report even after **208 days since the due date for submission**.
- Given the anonymity provided to donors by the scheme, it is seen that Electoral Bonds have emerged as the most popular mode of donations to Regional Political parties for FY 2020-21. More than 47.34% of the total income (Rs 250.60 cr) of the 31 Regional political parties analysed for FY 2020-21 is received from *Donations through Electoral Bonds*.
- The most common and popular items of expenditure for regional parties for FY 2020-21 are election expenses/general propaganda and administrative/general expenses.
- Janata Dal Secular (JDS) has declared membership fees and other fees under the Grants/donations/Contributions for the FY 2020-21.
- For the FY 2019-20, more than 62% of the total income of seven National Parties came from Donations through Electoral Bonds (Rs 2993.826 cr), wherein identity of the donor is not disclosed to the public. Of the Regional parties that have submitted their audit reports, 14 Regional Parties (TRS, TDP, YSR-C, BJD, DMK, SHS, AAP, JDU, SP, JDS, SAD, AIADMK, RJD & JMM) have declared receiving donations through Electoral Bonds worth Rs 447.498 cr, which is 50.97%.
- As per the data shared by SBI in response to ADR's RTI application, Electoral Bonds worth Rs 324.36 cr were redeemed by parties in FY 2020-21. 5 Regional Parties (YSR-Congress- Rs 96.25 cr, DMK- Rs 80.00 cr, BJD- Rs 67.00 cr, AAP- Rs 5.95 cr and JDU- Rs 1.40 cr) have declared receiving donations through Electoral Bonds worth Rs 250.60 cr
- During FY 2020-21, out of the 31 Regional Parties, only **JDS** declared receiving a total income of **Rs 4.6855 cr** from **Sale** of **Coupons**.
- Among the national parties, the **audit report** of **BJP** for the **FY 2020-21 is unavailable** on the ECI website at the time of preparation of this report.

Recommendations of ADR

- The Supreme Court gave a judgment on September 13, 2013 declaring that no part of a candidate's affidavit should be left blank. Along the same lines, we recommend that the Election Commission of India impose rules that **no part of the Form 24A submitted by political parties providing details of donations above Rs 20,000 should be left blank**.
- Full details of all donors should be made available for public scrutiny under the RTI. Some countries where this is done include Bhutan, Nepal, Germany, France, Italy, Brazil, Bulgaria, the US and Japan. In none of these countries is it possible for 75% of the source of funds to be unknown. According to the Finance Act, 2017, Section 13A of the IT Act was amended to state that tax exemption will be given to registered political parties "Provided also that such political party furnishes a return of income for the previous year in accordance with the provisions of sub-section (4B) of section 139 on or before the due date under that section." Thus, any party which does not submit its IT returns on or before the due date, their income should not be tax-exempted and defaulting parties should be derecognized.
- Electoral Bonds infringe the citizen's fundamental 'Right to Know' by withholding crucial information regarding electoral
 funding. Such opaqueness is at the cost of larger public interest and is a severe blow to the very fundamentals of
 transparency and accountability. Serious concerns have been raised by civil society as well as constitutional authorities
 such as EC and RBI that anonymous donations through Electoral Bonds will encourage money laundering and lead to
 increased use of black money for political funding through shell companies. Therefore, Electoral Bonds Scheme, 2018
 should be entirely scrapped.





- In the case of continuance of the Scheme, the principle of anonymity of the bond donor enshrined in the Electoral Bond Scheme, 2018 must be done away with. All political parties which receive donations through Electoral Bonds should declare in their Contributions Reports the total amount of such donations received in the given financial year, along with the detailed particulars of the donors as against each Bond; the amount of each such bond and the full particulars of the credit received against each bond. The procedures and reporting framework for the above must be standardized to ensure that a true picture of the financial position of the political parties is revealed to the general public.
- The ECI/CBDT/CAG or any other relevant institution should be entrusted with the responsibility to oversee that there
 is no discrepancy between the value of Electoral Bonds redeemed and the value of donations received through
 Electoral Bonds by the political parties, and whether only entitled political parties are receiving funding via Electoral
 Bonds.
- All Political parties must provide all information on their finances under the Right to Information Act. This will only strengthen political parties, elections and democracy.
- Those parties not following the ICAI guidelines for auditing of reports should be scrutinized by the IT department.

Need for a strict mechanism for reporting financial information

To ensure that there is financial transparency and accountability on the part of the political parties, there must be a strict mechanism with respect to reporting of financial information. The procedures and reporting framework must be standardized to ensure that a true picture of the financial position of the political parties is revealed to the general public. Institute of Chartered Accounts of India (ICAI) has put forward a set of recommendations on the request of the Election Commission of India (ECI). These recommendations relate to a standardized and comprehensive reporting framework of financial statements of political parties. ADR feels that there is a dire need for these recommendations to be implemented at the earliest.

Detailed Report

Status of submission of Annual Audit reports by the Regional Parties, FY 2020-21

- The due date for submission of annual audited accounts for the parties was 31st October, '21.
- **5 (NPF, PDA, RLD, AAP and PMK) of the 31 Regional Parties** had **submitted their audit reports on time**, while 26 parties delayed their submission by several days, ranging from **1 day to 144 days**.
- 208 days since the due date for submission, audit reports of the remaining 23 Regional Parties for FY 2020-21 are yet to be available on the website of the ECI, at the time of preparation of this report.
- Some of the political parties whose audited statements are yet to be available on the ECI website include major political parties like AJSU, RJD, SP, BPF, JKNC, and AIUDF etc.

Total Income and Expenditure of Regional Parties, FY 2020-21

• During FY 2020-21, the **total income** declared by **31 Regional Political Parties** was **Rs 529.416 cr** while the total expenditure incurred by these parties amounts to **Rs 414.028 cr**, resulting in **21.80** % of the income **remaining unspent**.






- The top 5 parties with highest total declared income include DMK, YSR-Congress, BJD, JDU & TRS. DMK has the highest income of Rs 149.95 cr or 28.324% amongst all the 31 Regional parties whose audit reports are available on the ECI website.
- In terms of the total declared expenditure, **DMK** spent the highest amount of **Rs 218.49 cr** followed by **TDP** and **AIADMK**, which spent **Rs 54.769 cr** and **Rs 42.367 cr** respectively.
- 14 out of 31 political parties, which have submitted their audit reports, have incurred expenditure more than their total income. Out of these, JKPDP, SDF, TDP, NPF, and JDS have spent more than 100% of their total income during FY 2020-21.
- During FY 2020-21, the top five political parties with excess of income over expenditure include YSR-Congress, BJD, JDU, TRS and SHS. YSR-Congress has the highest 'excess of income over expenditure' of Rs 107.183 cr, followed by BJD with Rs 66.332 cr and JDU with Rs 40.963 cr.


Total Income and Expenditure declared by Regional Parties, FY 2020-21 (in Rs Cr)



Comparison of Income of Regional Parties, FY 2019-20 and FY 2020-21

- Total income of the 29 out of 31 parties, whose audit reports are available for both FY 2019-20 and 2020-21, decreased from Rs 800.264 cr in FY 2019-20 to Rs 520.492 cr in FY 2020-21, a total decrease of 34.96% or Rs 279.775 cr.
- **10 parties** have shown an **increase in their income** from FY 2019-20 to FY 2020-21 while **21 parties** have shown a **decline in their income** during this period.
- Comparing the income of top 5 parties for FY 2020-21 with the previous financial year, **DMK** declared the highest increase in its income of **Rs 85.046** cr or **131%**, followed by **JDU** and **YSR-Congress** which declared a total increase of **Rs 41.956** cr or **180%** and **Rs 15.251** cr or **16%** respectively.
- SHS declared the maximum decrease in income between FY 2019-20 and 2020-21 by Rs 97.562 cr followed by TRS (Rs 92.802 cr) and TDP (Rs 88.278 cr).





- 5 out of 31 Regional political parties incurred more than 70% of their total expenditure on Election campaign expenditure or election/general propaganda.
- Amongst the top 3 parties, which have reported spending the highest overall amount, DMK spent the maximum, Rs 213.275 cr on followed by AIADMK which spent Rs 34.86 cr on Election Expenditure and AAP spent the highest, Rs 10.965 cr on Propaganda Expenses.



- 31 Regional Parties collected Rs 376.865 cr or 71.19% of their total income from voluntary contributions (includes donations via Electoral Bonds and other Donations & Contributions) for FY 2020-21.
- During FY 2020-21, out of the 31 political parties whose annual audit reports are available on the ECI website, **5 political** parties have declared receiving **donations through Electoral Bonds** amounting to a total of **Rs 250.60 cr**.
- YSR-Congress received the highest donations worth Rs 96.25 cr or 89.13% of its total income through Electoral Bonds followed by DMK declaring Electoral Bonds worth Rs 80.00 cr or 53.35% and BJD (Rs 67.00 cr or 91.35%).
- **15.99%** or **Rs 84.60 cr** of the total income was generated through **Interest Income & FDRs** by the political parties for FY 2020-21.
